Absentee/early voting for general election begins Sept. 23

Absentee voting for the statewide general election begins Sept. 23 and continues through Monday, Nov. 7. Due to state legislative changes that allow for no-excuse absentee voting, a higher voter turnout by absentee ballot is expected. Voters may either vote an absentee ballot by mail or in-person at one of the county's service centers or the county Government Center in Stillwater. If voting by mail, voters are encouraged to apply for an absentee ballot online through the Minnesota Secretary of State's Office at mnvotes.org. When voters use the online

application, they are able to track their ballot online throughout the voting process. The online applications are processed by Washington County and ballots will be mailed to the voters applying online. Absentee voters may request their absentee ballot anytime and are encouraged to make their request early so ballots can be mailed as soon as they are available on Sept. 23. Voters must return their ballot by Election Day. Voters may call 651-430-6175 to have an absentee ballot application mailed to them.

If voting in person, state law now allows absentee voters in the seven days before the election to place their ballots directly into the tabulator, just as they would do on Election Day at a polling place. This allows voters to know immediately that their ballots have been accepted with no errors, and to have the same experience, regardless of whether they vote on Election Day or cast their ballot early. Voters may vote in person at the Washington County Service Centers or Government Center:

- Cottage Grove Service Center, 13000 Ravine Parkway, Cottage Grove;
- Government Center in Stillwater, 14949 62nd St. N., Stillwater;
- Headwaters Service Center, 19955 Forest Road N., Forest Lake;
- Woodbury Service Center, 2150 Radio Drive, Woodbury.

Absentee voters waiting to vote may experience long lines and the potential for a long wait. Voters are encouraged to vote at the Cottage Grove Service Center or the Government Center in Stillwater, as the Woodbury Service Center is especially busy with absentee voters.

Absentee voting hours at the county service centers and government center are Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Additional hours for absentee balloting will be offered from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 5.

To vote by absentee ballot or in person at the polling place, eligible individuals need to be registered at their current address. Voters may register to vote online through the Minnesota Secretary of State's Office at mnvotes.org.

Online pre-registration closes Tuesday, Oct. 18. Questions about the general election, absentee voting, or voter registration may be directed to Washington County at 651-430-6175.

To help keep taxes low, the city relies on residents to help keep corners and rights-of-way clear of vegetation for visibility and line-of-sight issues. Please help us by ensuring that your right-of-way is clear of vegetation at least 6 feet from the

edge of the paved street which will also help with snowplowing. The snowplows need the right-of-way to push the snow off the roads, otherwise our streets become too narrow. The City asks that residents please refrain from marking the edge of the right-of-way with reflectors, rocks, and steel poles. Information on Finding Lost Pets

I seem to be hearing more and more frequently that when a pet gets lost the owners of the pet are unsure or just do not know where to start to look for them. Having been in the animal control field for almost 40 years I would like to offer some insight or advice to those in this position. First, as soon as you notice the pet missing call your animal control officer (715-386-7789). If you do not know who that is, call your City, Town, or Village hall. They will know this information. File a report with them. If Animal Control hasn't yet picked the animal up they will have that information should there be a call. That way they can try to get your pet back to you before it goes to the impound facility. Second call your impound facility.

This would be the Animal Humane Society in Woodbury, Minn. 651-730-6008. They will tell you if any animals matching the description of your lost pet have been brought in to them. By state law animals brought to the impound as strays need to be held for 5 days in Minnesota and 7 days for Wisconsin. This is to give an owner the opportunity to find their pet. When the holding period has expired the animals are reevaluated for health and temperament. If they are adoptable they are then put up for adoption and rehomed. These are the two single most important steps.

3) Let your neighbors know especially the neighborhood kids. Kids go places adults wouldn't think of going. Pets don't often stray far from familiar territory at first. Check under bushes, up trees (cats), in and around out buildings and garages. Just get the word out. The more people that know your pet is missing the more likely it is to be found.

4) Post it on social media. I am not a computer person but it is clearly amazing how fast I have seen animals reunited with their owners from just a single post to Facebook. There are several web sites that will list your lost pet for you.

Lost Dogs of Minn/Lost Dogs of WI. These places can also refer you to sites for lost cats and even birds.

5) Call the local veterinary hospitals and clinics. The majority will take a lost report and post it in case an injured stray or a newly found animal comes in for treatment.

6) Place familiar objects outside the door the pet exited, or in a spot that the pet frequented when outside. The pet is more likely to hang around familiar scents and objects so put a blanket, towel, their bed or crate, something with your scent on it near the spot. If you feel comfortable doing so leave some of the pet's food in the same area. Be aware though that food left out also attracts wildlife and other stray animals. Nobody can search 24/7 for their lost pet. Leave a light on outside if possible and keep alert for signs that your pet has returned.

7) Don't stop looking. In my experience most pets do eventually turn up someplace. I have returned pets that have been lost for up to 3 years.

The best piece of advice I have for pet owners is to be sure you have some form of identification on your pet. Microchips are ideal but are not a guarantee. Many times I have scanned for a chip, found one only to find out the pet owner didn't register the chip with the company or they changed their address or phone and didn't notify them. Be sure your contact information is up to date at the microchip company, veterinary hospital and on all tags your pet is wearing. Last but definitely not least, Do Not leave your pet outside unattended.

Voter Registration

If you have voted in this city during the past four years and have not changed residence within the city, you need not register again. If you are not a registered voter, you can register with the Washington County Auditor's Office (see applicable dates below) or you may register at City Hall on Election Day. Please bring one of the following when you register:

- Driver license/permit or receipt
- MN identification card or receipt
- Registration in the same precinct
- Notice of late registration
- A registered voter from this precinct who will sign an oath as to your eligibility.
- Utility bill with a photo ID. The bill must show current address and be due within 30 days of the election.
(Mobil/Cell phone bill is not acceptable.)

Employees Time Off To Vote

Every employee who is eligible to vote in a state primary and general election has the right to be absent from work for the purpose of voting during the morning of the day of that election, without penalty or deduction from salary or wages because of the absence.

Write-In Candidates

A blank space is provided on the ballot for each office for write-in candidates. You may write the candidate's name in the blank and then complete the oval to the left of the name.

Municipal Election

At the November election, city voters will elect a Mayor and two Council Members. Each candidate who has filed for office has been invited to submit a statement for publication the City Newsletter (printed elsewhere in this newsletter). A list of the candidates follows.

Please note that there are **two vacancies for the 4-year Council Member term.** Our election judges report that we usually have a high number of "undervotes" for these offices. We think that this is because the **Municipal Offices are at the**

Campaign Sign Placement

The City, County and State have laws prohibiting the placement of political signs on public property. These laws promote safety for motorists and other users of the streets and highways.

**Political signs are allowed on private property,
NOT IN RIGHT OF WAY, with the consent of
the owner of the property.**

If you need help in determining the location of the City right-of-way in relation to the placement of signs, you may try the following suggestions. Place the sign on the private property side of the curb stop in your front yard. Also, with a few exceptions, most street rights-of-way are 40 feet wide - place the sign at least 10 feet from the edge of the blacktop street surface.
